GREEN FROGS

To get things started, the froggies talked all about different things that they see and use when it is cold outside. Some of the terms that they came up with about snow were white, fluffy, soft, chilly and freezing. They also discussed creating snowmen and snow angles. When asked what clothes should be worn in snowy weather, the children responded with a hat, gloves, snow pants, boots, and a scarf.

This was a great way to encourage communication while classifying and using academic vocabulary.

As we moved onto cloudy and windy weather, the children were able to feel the wind in their hair and build solid connections. Once we had a good idea of what the wind felt like, we used the wind in our lungs to create silly characters. Each child chose a silly face that was missing one thing, HAIR!. To give our characters hair, the froggies used a straw, multi colored paint, and the wind in their lungs. The children laughed and laughed as the hair of their silly faces began to grow and move! This was a fun way to bring the word "wind" to life.

After cloudy and windy, the class moved onto rainy stormy weather. During this time the Green Frogs used grey clouds and rain drops to construct their names. Each child

was provided with rain drops and encouraged to write each letter of their name on one, and then to build their cloud. What a fun way to encourage letter recognition, handwriting skills, and fine motor skills!

Finally, the Frogs entered sunny hot weather! Each child was able to create his/her very own sun by cutting out a circle and rolling a dice to determine the number of rays on their sun! They used hand eye coordination, quantifying, and counting during this activity!

The Green Frogs had a blast with their weather study but cannot wait to see what is coming up next!

We also took the time to find out what the surface of the different planets was like so that we could try to duplicate them on our Solar System in our room. Although seeing the planets from the Blue Gills classroom during the day wasn't possible, we talked about what kinds of tools you need to see that far away.

The children took the study to another level by building and creating their own rocket ships and lunar modules in the block area, making sure to inspect each vehicle to make sure it is ready for the right terrain. It got us thinking, and planning, and ultimately using cooperative play to get us ready for space travel. It was a great study!
