### YELLOW DUCKS



surrounds them. We value the parent's encouragement of development and understanding.



#### URPLE PARROTS


he toddlers were able to learn more about the world around them this month by taking an in depth look at animals and nature! We started the month by learning about animals in zoos. We built cages for our zebras, lions, and elephants out of small and large blocks. We also used playdoh and popsicle sticks to construct! These activities increase

> hand eye coordination, fine/gross motor skills, and the understanding of spatial relationships.

To further our zoo animal knowledge, we performed animal sounds and actions during an animal freeze dance song. The toddlers love using their liveliness to act like animals!
