November was filled with thankful thoughts and gestures in the Yellow Ducks classroom. To kick off the November month, the Ducks showed appreciation for the Mexican holiday of Día De Los Muertos. Día de Los Muertos, or Day of the Dead, is typically a two-day celebration (November 1st and 2nd) of life and death. The Ducks honored the holiday through fun crafts and activities such as creating handprint skulls and water coloring sugar skull templates.

Throughout the month the Ducks also expressed appreciation of fall colors and elements through sensory play. Providing opportunities for children to actively use their senses as they explore their world through 'sensory play' is crucial to brain development. Sensory play encourages learning through exploration, curiosity, problem-solving, and creativity.

A sensory-based activity the Ducks enjoyed was exploring a fall sensory bin! The Yellow Ducks teachers set up a bin with leaves, plastic pumpkins, and gourds! As the Ducks explored the sensory bin, the teachers explained textures they might feel as well as assisted in expanding their vocabulary by naming colors! PURPLE PARROTS

The month of November has flown by in the Purple Parrots room. The toddlers were taught how to be kind friends with one another. We did this by creating friendships within the classroom, working together to build a friendship quilt, and being thankful for everyone in our classroom. What a better month to become closer to one another and build formidable friendships!

The Purple Parrots spent the month working together to build on our relationships by recognizing who is in our classroom. The Purple Parrots used their expressive language and recognition to identify their peers within the classroom. During mealtimes the teachers inquired "Where's" the toddlers were encouraged to look around and identify who their peers are. The toddlers get so excited when it is their turn for their peers to find them. While identifying their peers the toddlers were also using their ability to take turns.

The toddlers used their fine motor skills to work together to create a friendship quilt. Fine motor skills are the coordination of small muscles in movement with the eyes, usually involving the synchronization of hands and fingers. The toddlers used their fine motor skills by using their palmar grasp and pincer grip to color the puzzle pieces. Once the toddlers colored together the teachers put the pieces together to create the friendship quilt.

The Purple Parrots are excited to see what the month of December will hold. We cannot wait to get into the Christmas spirit!

GREEN FROGS

This month, the Green Frogs explored the season of fall/autumn. We created our own autumn leaves as we marbled paper with the colors of fall. The Frogs then used their fine motor skills as we cut out the leaves. We made a chart of which fall-colored leaf was our favorite. Red was our favorite color with green running a close second.



We continued practicing our fine motor skills as we created a flock of turkeys. The Frogs expressed their creativity as they picked their favorite way to form feathers for their own turkey: drawing and rubbing chalk, sponge painting, or gluing colorful real feathers to their fabulous fall birds.

The Green Frogs helped to prepare our annual Thanksgiving feast by working together to make an apple crisp. We use our math knowledge as we measured the ingredients and our upper body muscles to stir the ingredients together.

We continued expanding our math knowledge as we created patterned turkey headbands. The Frogs glued colored squares in an AB pattern on a strip of paper and then added a turkey face to complete the look of our Thanksgiving headbands.

This fun and festive accessory also helped us practice our pattern recognition.

A celebration is always better when shared with friends. The Green Frogs enjoyed sharing their feast with the Red Robins. ORANGE OWLS

The Orange Owls trekked through the depths of the jungle this month as we immersed ourselves in the animals, vegetation, and geology. The jungle is home to some of the most exotic animals on the planet, many we knew a great deal about and some we did not even know existed! We took an in-depth at the various animals and how they each have a part in the grand scheme of the jungle. One of our favorite animals to dive into were snakes. The number of different species of snakes is what caught our attention most. Each one of the nearly 3,600 different species has unique characteristics, lives in very specific environments, and can be the size of a small rodent all the way to the size of a small car! We used the various animals of the jungle to help us count and practice our beginning letter sounds. As we were introduced to each animal throughout the dense layers of the jungle, we were able to look at the names of each of them and determine the beginning letter and sound was for each. With these letters, we compared them to each other's names and the other animals of the jungle.

It is endless to count within the jungle because there is so much happening all at once! From counting the different layers to the many types of monkeys swinging from the trees, numbers were never in short supply! The jungle study provided an appropriate length of counting activities for all abilities in our classroom.

We closed out our month with one of our favorite days here at Kid Country- our Thanksgiving Feast. We used this week to reflect on what we are thankful for, how important our family and friends are to us, and just overall taking that time to express our happiness and gratitude for the endless blessings of our lives.
