Silver Circle Again!

Kid Country Childcare has once again earned the Silver Circle of Quality designation from the State of Illinois! What a great way to start 2019!

The ExceleRate Illinois program was put into place to recognize childcare centers that have gone above and beyond DCFS licensing standards to provide high quality childcare. This program not only assesses our classroom practices, but also reviews our interactions with children, our business practices, and the education of our teachers.

The first part of the review was submitting our paperwork and ExceleRate personnel verifying that we have adequate teachers with the correct level of education and credentials. Once we passed that hurdle, an independent assessor came to Kid Country to interview me and review our business practices. The last step (and the most stressful) was when three separate assessors made an unannounced visit and monitored our classrooms for three hours.

After the assessors completed their reports, we were notified that we once again passed their rigorous process and earned the Silver Circle of Quality! Kid Country first earned this designation in 2015. I could not be prouder of our teachers and staff for once again earning this designation. Please join me in

congratulating them for their continued commitment to quality early childhood education and care!

I am also super excited about our fundraiser that is planned for February 23! I am so grateful for the Robbins, Boseo, and Deaville families for spearheading this event and for starting a Parent Group for Kid Country!

GREEN FROGS

Christmas cheer filled the air in the Green Frogs room as we began to prepare for Christmas day! To help deck our bare walls, the Frogs used a bristle brush and green paint to stamp beautiful wreaths and a cotton ball to dot our boughs of holly. Using different types of brushes and stamping techniques during painting encourages the children to think more creatively and strengthens different muscles in their hands and arms.

Once our wreaths were complete, we decided to make Christmas trees to hang in our Green Frogs tree farm. To complete this project, the Green Frogs had to identify each letter of their first names. Once they had done so, a color was assigned to each letter and the Frogs were tasked with matching each colored ornament with its' corresponding letter on the tree. This project reinforced letter recognition while also working their fine motor coordination as they peeled apart each piece of tissue paper and placed it in the correct spot.

Christmas cannot take place without Santa and his reindeer and the Green Frogs worked diligently to create enough reindeer to fly Santa's large sleigh! We worked on our cutting skills as we cut out rectangles and squares to create our reindeer bodies. We also counted the number of eyes, noses, and tails that we wanted on our reindeers. The Frogs enjoyed some gross motor fun with this activity as we participated in Christmas yoga.

The Frogs had a blast pretending to fly Santa's sleigh, standing tall like Christmas trees, and twinkling like stars. Last, but certainly not least, the Green Frogs made holly jolly Santa faces. In this activity, each strip of Santa's beard contains



one letter of the child's name. The Green Frogs identified each letter and put them in the correct order before gluing them to Santa's smiling face!

Once we felt that our room contained enough Christmas spirit, we worked together to create reindeer food for the big night! Several ingredients including sunflower seeds, Cheerios, oats, and glitter were placed on the table for the Frogs to utilize. Each ingredient was given a specific measurement such as "1 scoop" or "3 scoops." The Frogs each received

a bag and worked to identify each numerical measurement as they created their yummy reindeer mix!

The beginning stages of communication are brief eye contact, simple back and forth conversation and pausing for the other person to talk.

The month of December also brought holiday spirits and a classroom celebration. The Yellow Ducks had a wonderful time dancing and playing around in the whipped cream. After their fun snack, the babies practiced unwrapping presents, which were toys from around the classroom that were wrapped up. The children giggled with excitement as they opened the toys. To engage each child's entire body during gross motor play, Ms. Emily set up three stations of different methods of coloring. One station was group coloring with markers around the table, the second station was a large piece of paper on the tile with crayons, and the final station was a large paper taped to the wall with colored pencils. The children were divided into three groups and switched from
