The month of December turned the Purple Parrots into small scientists! The Parrots tried out two exciting science experiments including making "Reindeer Toothpaste" and melting a Christmas tree. To make reindeer toothpaste, the toddlers observed as the teachers mixed dry yeast, warm water, food coloring, and glitter in an empty water bottle. As hydrogen peroxide was added, the green sparkly mixture began to fizz and foam up and out of the water bottle, much to the toddlers' delight. We used words such as foaming, bubbles, and fizz to describe this chemical reaction. The melting Christmas trees involved pouring vinegar over green baking soda trees, also producing a fizzing, bubbling reaction.

Watching experiments such as these enhances several skills for our small scientists. The toddlers are observing the scientific process, which includes inquiry and action/reaction. The teachers describe the step by step process and question what will happen next aloud. Watching the reaction while listening to the description starts the toddlers thinking about actions/reactions. It causes them to begin to ponder how things work not only for just this experiment, but possibly for many other things they see in their world. Observing as a class also helps the toddlers learn how to manage their feelings and take care of their own needs while in a group setting, which is an extremely important life skill. Another benefit of a group experiment is the language enhancement. The toddlers are hearing new language not only from the teachers, but from their older peers as well. We can't wait to keep experimenting more in the New Year!

slower because of the sun, and the bowl inside would be quicker because it is "very cold" in the freezer! Through our observation the bin froze quicker! Afterwards, we thought it may be because the bin is in fact a bit smaller than the bowl.

Among the various celebrations throughout the month, our top two were cookies with Miss Donna and our Holiday party! Miss Donna had us more than intrigued with her new holiday stories of acceptance, giving,



and the love of family! Then to close out the week we played some reindeer games, made beautiful crafts, and had a delectable snack for our Holiday party! Our Christmas tree snack and snowball fight made our week!
