GREEN

In the month of February, the Green Frogs finished up our study of the zoo as we discussed animals that live in the reptile

house. The Frog teachers introduced the class to the new term "reptiles" and explained that reptiles are animals that do not have fur, lay eggs, and have short legs. We discussed several reptiles including turtles, alligators, and snakes. We put our gross motor coordination to the test as we attempted to slither like snakes,

without using our arms and legs, and to move slowly like a turtle.

The Frogs enhanced their cutting skills as they cut many skinny strips to create a patterned chain snake. When choosing where to hang our snakes in the classroom, the Frogs learned that many snakes enjoy climbing trees and that some like to swim in the water.

Once our snakes were complete, we

started to create our adorable egg carton turtles. After viewing several pictures of real turtles, the Frogs had the opportunity to let their creativity run wild as they painted their own turtle shells. Once dry, we added a pom-pom ball head and googly eyes to complete our project. The Frogs discussed with their teachers that turtles like to be in the water, but tortoises prefer to stay on the land.

Communicating through this activity was a must to be able to win. Many children got upset and frustrated when they realized how hard it really was and wanted to give up. The other children in the group encouraged them not to give up and helped them succeed and finish the challenge. It's great to see the group encourage each other like this!

Another activity they enjoyed was blowing a pom-pom

across the room blowing using a straw. This was an excellent game that encouraged turn taking and to be patient while waiting for each other to get across the room. The children were cheering for their teammates and using good sportsmanship. Team work is a goal that is always strived for and encouraged in the Blue Dolphin room, and the Dolphins blew it out of the park this month!

Purple Parrots

hat a messy month the toddlers have had, but these great messes came with great learning opportunities! To kick off the month of February the toddlers participated in a larger than life painting activity. Pink, purple, and red paint were dumped on the table tops and the children were encouraged to dive in hands first. While putting their fine motor, sensory, and communication skills to work the toddlers spread the paint all around

mixing it and exploring the feeling of wet paint between their fingers. Once the table and their hands were covered in paint, a large piece of paper was placed on top in hopes of transferring the prints that the toddlers left behind. When the paper was removed the toddlers engaged in meaningful conversations about what they saw. Words like pink, purple, red, mine, cold, and don't touch filled the air. Later in the month, the toddlers were able to explore another messy activity. They were each given a scoop of cool whip and a few drops of food coloring. They were encouraged to use a wooden stick or their fingers to mix the colors together. This was another opportunity to discuss the different colors and what they made when they were mixed. It was also a great way to engage their sensory skills and taste buds!

The month of February has been a blast but the toddlers are ready to dive into learning colors and animals using the book "Brown Bear, Brown Bear" by Eric Carle.

Though February was short, it was full of much excitement! We began the month with a trek to the African Planes. With this we were able to explore not only the various wildlife and terrain, but the inhabitants and their culture.

Our favorite project associated with this study was when we created our Maasai necklaces. We were able to use vivid colors and patterns to match the different tribes all while learning what each color represents. Just as we see different color combinations and meanings in our culture, we can see similarities throughout theirs. Some examples are blue for the sky and water, green for the grass and crops, and yellow for happiness and friendship. As a class, we learned a new African Board Game. The game taught us how "simple" can be fun and reminded us that even though there may not be many resources around, there can always be a way to come together.

As we ventured through different parts of Africa, we found ourselves touring through the great wonders it has to offer! We explored great heights with Mount Kilimanjaro, learning how it is now an extinct volcano. We learned how immense Victoria Falls is and how loud rushing, falling water truly is! We then we headed over to the pyramids of Egypt to learn about the various tools used to build such unique structures,

and we even made a few of our own!
