Surprise Windfall!

We were surprised by a windfall of toys this month! Last fall, Miss Michelle found a grant opportunity to provide new materials for infant, toddler and twos classrooms. The grant was being offered by our local childcare resource and referral (CCR&R) with a quick two-week response time. Miss Michelle talked with our teachers and compiled a wish list of materials that would enhance our programs and completed all of the grant paperwork. Unfortunately, we were informed several weeks later that we did not receive the grant.

However, a few weeks ago a delivery truck arrived and started unloading a bunch of boxes! As we opened them, we discovered these were items on our grant wishlist! Upon further investigation, we were told by CCR&R that they did end up granting a portion of our grant based on the number of applicants and funds available. When all was done, we received over \$1,900 worth of new materials!!! What great a surprise for us!

As soon as we confirmed we did indeed receive these through the grant, we quickly unpacked all of the boxes, and placed the materials in the classrooms. All of the pictures you see in this month's newsletter are children

playing with the new materials! We may not have received everything on our list, but we are extremely appreciative of the materials we did get. Taking advantage of these grant opportunities is so important for us in helping to keep costs down and still provide high quality materials. Thank you to the State for the grant offer and for Miss Michelle for doing such a great job of getting our grant together!

We have completed our 2020-21 registration process and will now be reaching out to those on our waitlists. If you know of anyone that is interested in attending Kid Country, now is the time for them to contact us -- spread the word!

Please remember that Kid Country will be closed on Monday, March 2 for an inservice day for our teachers. We will be getting re-certified in CPR and first aid, along with reviewing DCFS regulations and doing some team building activities. We will get a full eight hours of training completed towards our annual requirement of 20. And be sure you have Manhattan's Irish Fest on your calendar for March 6 & 7 -- this is the town's biggest celebration of the year! Everyone gets to be Irish on that weekend! Have fun!

GREEN FROGS

The Green Frogs spent most of this cold February inside continuing to study the Arctic. We started out the month by learning about **Eskimos**. We focused on a lot of fine motor skills as we cut out Eskimos with our adorable little faces on them! The Frogs had a good time learning about the science of **blubber** by using lard (in baggies) and ice-cold water to see that the lard helped keep their hands warm.

We also learned about walrus and about their **tusks**, **blubber**, and **whiskers**. We decorated walrus faces using paint, paper plates, yarn, and googly eyes. The walrus looked great on our walls swimming with the **icebergs**. The Froggies had a

blast when we turned our eating area into an ice-skating rink. Using wax paper, the Frogs glided

around the room and giggled while they wore **bufandas** (scarves) to help our imaginations soar!

When it was Valentine's Week, the Green Frogs had a wonderful time decorating the classroom with hearts, hearts, hearts! The Frogs practiced their letters by

making caterpillars out of hearts with their names on them. Practicing math concepts by measuring and mixing cupcakes as a class was fun but eating them was icing on the cake!! The class had fun at the Valentine's party, where they passed out goodies, played "Leap Hearts," "Pin the Lips on the Frog," bean bag toss, and decorated their marble paintings with a lot of stickers.

And finally, we're starting to see GREEN and wildlife!! Well, we are in our classroom, anyway. We have moved from the Arctic to the Rainforest. The Frogs enjoyed painting and decorating a **diorama**

(a mini rainforest). They also practiced their fine motor skills by cutting out large leaves to put on the tall trees and branches that have been set up to decorate the classroom walls. February brought the Blue Gills a lesson in love and respect for others. With each emotion that we explored, we found that we all have these feelings and that it is

Our motto during this study soon became: It doesn't take a lot to make someone feel good, you just have to think about how you like to be treated.

Mid-month we transitioned into a study that they were all excited for, ZOO ANIMALS.

Everyone has their favorite animal when visiting the zoo. So, we listed our favorites and started to learn more about those specific animals. We learned new facts about the different animals and expanded our

vocabulary with words like zoology, pachyderm, marsupial, and nocturnal. For large motor we challenged our little bodies acting like the animals as we stomped, slithered, balanced, glided, and jumped. We even made binoculars to help us find the animals that had escaped from our zoo. We searched high and low throughout the room looking for different animals and writing down their names when we found them. Being a zookeeper is hard work, but spending time with the animals makes it worth it!
