Site was a class favorite as the Green Frogs wrapped up their study on buildings and construction. The children participated in several read alouds engaging in meaningful conversations along the way. They used enhanced vocabulary words like excavator and buildozer to communicate. The Froggies were also able to get creative and build their own construction vehicle using shapes! They used their fine motor skills to cut and paste the shapes in place and then told their teachers and classmates all about them!

Later in the month, weather was introduced to the class. As a group we talked about the different types of weather and some of the features that go with them. We created a classroom chart to show which types of weather was the class favorite and which were not so popular. This activity was a great way to get the children to recognize and recall weather related experiences, implement math by graphing and counting, and introduce categorizing skills.

The Green Frogs had a fun filled month and cannot wait to see what the weather brings next month!

This is how nearly every meal is on a spaceship due to the lack of gravity. 
In addition, academically the Red Robins worked hard on the exploration of knowing their colors. Over the span of two
