We are super excited about summer here at Kid Country, and we are happy you are joining us!





his month the Purple Parrots utilized their time by diving into a sensory and texture study. To get this study started, the toddlers created many different art projects including a feather mural, texture coloring, and finger painting. These are all great examples of the different sensations that can be experienced through their fingers and hands.

As we created these masterpieces, we talked all about the feeling of different objects that are smooth, bumpy, hard, soft, squishy, wet, dry, and many more. This was a great way to begin making connections and introducing some new vocabulary! Art was not the only way we explored textures, we also engaged in some fun filled group

activities. A large piece of contact paper was set out on the floor and we each had a turn walking over it bare foot. This was a great way to introduce the idea of "sticky" to the children and get them to interact with their peers. In addition to sticky feet, we also used our fine motor skills to dive

into play doh and slime. Digging our fingers into the cool wet slime and feeling the coolness of the playdoh allowed us to experience yet another fun texture.

This month the Frogs enjoyed exploring new smells, tastes, and textures as we explored the remaining three of our senses! We began the month by learning all about our sense of smell.

The Frogs loved laughing and giggling to several silly books about smelly bears, and dirty hair. We played a mystery smell game where the Frogs were given the challenge to identify six smelly objects while blindfolded! The Frogs were shocked to see that they were unable to identify the smell of grass and cookies! We had wonderful conversations during our circle times about our favorite smells. We talked about all of our favorite meals and even made a chart illustrating some of the good and bad smells that we face every day. The Frogs practiced their handwriting as they wrote their names and covered them with different colored Jell-o powder! We had a blast taking turns smelling each other's names and talking about what flavor each color must be.

During the month of May we also talked about our sense of taste. Everyone in the classroom was very excited to learn all about the different recipes and foods that we were going to sample during the week! To start our week, we tested something very familiar: Skittles. The Frogs participated in a blind-folded taste test challenge to see if they could identify each color only using their taste buds. We also talked about the difference between sweet, salty, sour, and bitter foods. Looking at a diagram of a tongue, we pointed to each section of our tongues and discussed how each specific section perceives different tastes. We sampled sour lemons, salty pretzels, sweet marshmallows, and bitter dark chocolate. We also had the chance to taste some delicious gourmet popcorn! We made a classroom chart illustrating each Frog's favorite popcorn flavor after sampling grape, cheese, and butter. As a culminating activity, the Frogs made delicious dirt pudding

To end our month of May, the Frogs learned all about touch. We spent a large amount of time exploring nature and the textures present in the trees, grass, flowers, and concrete. We made nature rubbings by rubbing

crayons on paper over each Frog's favorite natural texture. We also practiced touching without seeing as we practiced seeing with our hands. The Frogs were asked to put their hands in a cloth bag and try to identify the toy hidden inside of it. Everyone did a great job using their reasoning skills to identify the
