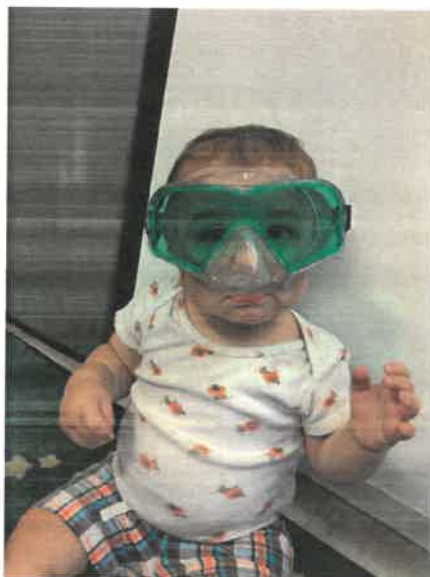

of problem-solving skills.

This month was jammed packed with not only activities, but lifelong lessons such as sharing, making friends, using bigger muscles, and learning all about new things! # YELLOW DUCKS

July has been a fun and exciting month for the Yellow Ducks. The Yellow Ducks did a lot of activities involving fine motor skills. Fine motor skills are the movements and use of hands and upper extremities. Reaching, grasping, and manipulating objects with hands are all examples of fine motor skills that the Yellow Ducks use daily. Fine motor skills also involve visual motor skills, specifically hand-eye coordination. These visual motor skills are used to coordinate hands, legs, and the rest of the body.

Examples of the activities that the Yellow Ducks did to enhance fine motor skills were bean bag toss game during our Carnival Day, using a spoon with our special Shark Week snack, and coloring with markers to decorate our cardboard playhouse. For the bean bag toss game, the Yellow Ducks used their fine motor skills to pick up the bean bags and toss them into buckets. Then the children used their fine motor and visual skills to maneuver their spoons to eat their shark pudding

and place the spoon into their mouths. Finally, the Yellow Ducks used their pincer grasp to hold onto their markers to color the cardboard plays house for the classroom.
