Our older toddlers have been working on self-help skills that they will carry with them to the next classroom. These self-help skills include washing and drying their own hands, drinking from an open-faced cup, using their utensils, and cleaning up after mealtimes.

July was full of summer fun for the Purple Parrots! The toddlers dove into the ocean by using their sensory skills. Sensory skills those such as vision, hearing, touch, smell, and taste. Sensory skills are used to help the toddler's growth, development, and learning within the world around them. The toddlers used their sensory skills to taste and feel a new snack (Jell-O), explored in a soap foam sensory bin, dove into a shark sensory bin, painted their feet to create flip-flop footprints, cooled off during water days, and enjoyed a pom-pom squeeze water play. These are just a few sensory activities the toddlers enjoyed this month!

The Purple Parrots wrapped up their summer fun by enjoying a few fun summer field trips that came to Kid Country. These activities included Shark Week, Carnival Day, Camping Week, and a visit from a clown! These fun activities offer many experiences for our toddlers such as interacting with our peers, gaining social skills, and connecting to life experiences. The toddlers and teachers held many conversations connecting their field trip experience to their home life. We talked about seeing sharks in the ocean, visiting a circus, swimming at home or the water park, camping with family, and eating special treats at home with our friends and family. Gross motor skills help the Yellow Ducks navigate their environments as they begin to crawl and move around. These skills are needed for the Yellow Ducks development for

performing everyday functions.

The Yellow Duck classroom focuses on the development of each individual child and customizes learning opportunities to optimize all moments.
