Social Skills are the Key

My goal here at Kid Country is for your children to leave here as confident, well-adjusted children that love school! Every day I see more and more research that tells us the single best indicator of school success is great social skills. At Kid Country, we have always focused on social skills, as we believe that children that are well adjusted in the classroom are then able to learn the academic side of things.

What does all this mean for your child? As stated in the Creative Curriculum Objectives for Development & Learning, young children's social-emotional development involves learning how to understand their own and others' feelings, regulate and express their emotions appropriately, build relationships with others, and interact in groups. Basically, we want your child to be able to function appropriately within a group – whether that group is here at Kid Country, in a first or second grade classroom, or a family dinner at grandma's house. And guess what? These skills translate into successful employees later in life!

What does all this social-emotional learning look like in our classrooms? Of course, it looks different in every classroom and age group, but the goal is all the same. For instance, one of our objectives is to help children regulate their own emotions and behaviors. A baby that is learning to manage his/her own feelings calms himself when gently touched or is soothed when picked up. Controlling his/her strong emotions as a preschooler is observed when a child tells another "I'm mad you are not sharing the blocks, I'm not going to play with you" and then moves to another area. Our classroom curriculum is set up to assist every child go

from crying because another child took their toy to peacefully talking out their differences with another child and coming up with a solution that works for everyone. Again, life skills that will help your child be a success!

You are probably now asking "What can I do at home to help?" The National Association for the Education of Young Children suggests:

- **Think out loud.** When your child hears your thinking process, it helps her understand how to cope with frustration and solve problems: "Whoops. My favorite shopping bag has a hole in it. I'd better take another one with me to the grocery store."
- **Do a job together.** Instead of asking your child to do a chore alone, do it with her. The two of you might fold laundry, set the table, rake leaves, or paint a wall. Help your child join in by shortening the handle of a broom to make it child-size or providing a small paintbrush or roller.
- **Play games.** Card and board games and outdoor games such as tag or hop-scotch offer built-in opportunities for helping children learn to take turns, cooperate, handle frustration, and more. While playing games together, focus on fun instead of winning or losing.

I would add modeling to that list from NAEYC. Model the behaviors you want to see in your child and allow your child to see your emotions and how you appropriately deal with those emotions. And don't forget that parenting is a tough job! No one does it perfectly, and many of us (myself included) feel defeated at times. However, tomorrow is always a new day!

PURPLE PARROTS

While singing songs with their classmates, the toddlers develop their social and language skills.

The toddlers created fun art projects that corresponded to each song. For *Baby Shark*, the toddlers strengthened their fine motor skills by making their own ocean on contact paper using different sizes of tissue paper. *Baby Shark* is one of the Purple Parrots' favorite songs. The toddlers worked on their pincer grip when they created their own paper plate spider web for *The Itsy-Bitsy Spider*. The toddlers practiced their pincer grip by using markers to color the plate.

A fun gross motor activity the toddlers enjoyed was seeking the stars from *Twinkle Twinkle Little Star* from around the classroom. The toddlers jumped, reached, and hopped to get the stars. Then they used their traveling skills to transfer the stars to a piece of paper.

During this month, the teachers worked with the toddlers on counting up to five. Five bumble bees and five spiders were taped to each table as the toddlers gathered around and counted them as a group. The toddlers also added "pull" and "sad" to their sign language vocabulary. Sign language is a great opportunity for the toddlers to communicate with one another. The toddlers cannot wait to learn new songs and see what is planned for next month.
