#### **YELLOW DUCKS**

The Yellow Ducks classroom used the month of September to focus on furthering their social and emotional development by learning about a variety of topics such as shapes, the circus, and different emotions. Social/emotional development is the domain of child development that focuses on building relationships with others and acquiring an understanding of emotions and how to express and manage them.

The Duck teachers put together a variety of fun and colorful activities during their two week My Feelings unit meant to familiarize the Ducks with basic emotions such as happy, sad, angry, and surprised. The Ducks explored colored sensory bottles, discovered the different facial expressions they could make using mirrors, and engaged in several painting projects geared toward expressing emotion using color. In addition to these activities, the teachers also took the Ducks outside on walks where they were able to practice their social skills not only with each other, but also with their friends, the Purple Parrots.





The Ducks also practiced their social skills inside the classroom while learning about the concept of shapes. They worked together to create a collage of shapes using paper cutouts and contact paper and participated in a "shape search" where they had to find different shape cutouts that the teachers had hidden around the classroom. The Ducks also practiced their social skills by sharing and taking turns playing with shape sorter toys used to aid them in learning about shapes.

The Ducks finished out the month by learning about the circus in preparation for the circus-themed Family Fun Night. They made handprint and footprint animals for the bulletin board in the hallway and practiced their gross motor skills by playing circus games like "bozo buckets." Overall, the month of September was filled with fun and lots of social interaction and growth. We can't wait to see what the month of October brings to the Yellow Ducks classroom!

#### **PURPLE PARROTS**

The Purple Parrots spent the month learning about different types of transportation vehicles such as cars, airplanes, firetrucks, and trains. The Purple Parrots love using our transportation cars and driving them all around the room!

The Purple Parrots are making connections by identifying the different types of transportation vehicles to the ones they see while driving. Discussions included the different places you could see these vehicles (cars-road, airplanes-sky, firetrucks-fire station, and trainsrailroad). While we were outside the Purple Parrots were looking for cars that drove by on the road and airplanes that flew around in the sky. The Purple Parrots would get so excited once we found one! Growing our gross motor skills, we mimicked being airplanes by sticking our arms out and flying around the little playground like an airplane and drove like they were cars, firetrucks, and trains mimicking the sounds they make such as "beep, beep" and "chugga chugga choo choo." Continue the connection at home and point out these vehicles when on the road!

Learning about different transportation helps the Purple Parrots expand on their views of the world around them. As toddlers grow they start to become more curious about the world around and start to explore more. By teaching the Purple Parrots about different types of transportation vehicles it will help them categorize and make meaning about them. Learning about cars, airplanes, firetrucks, and trains help the Purple Parrots make the connections and realize there are different ways each vehicle works and the purpose of each one.

We are excited for the season to begin to change and the weather to start to cool off. We will take that excitement and put it towards learning about all things fall next month!

#### **RED ROBINS**

The month of September brought lots of new experiences for the Red Robins. The children began this month getting to know their teachers, new friends, and the classroom!

To start off the new year, the Red Robins teachers started incorporating self-help skills into the children's daily routines. This includes taking off/putting on shoes, sitting at the table, cleaning up after meals and using utensils. As children practice self-help skills, they begin to gain confidence in their ability to try new things, build self-esteem and promote independence.

In addition to learning self-help skills, the Red Robins also worked on improving their language development and social-emotional skills through our *All About Me* unit. The unit began with teaching the Robins about their emotions. The teachers assisted the children in identifying and labeling emotions and explained appropriate responses they may express to strong feelings.





As children learn to understand and regulate their emotions, they are better able to resolve conflicts in a positive way. As we continued our All About Me study, the teachers focused on expanding vocabulary. The Red Robins teachers introduced simple descriptive adjectives as we discussed different characteristics that make everyone unique. Introducing descriptive language encourages the use of clear communication and understanding.

Overall, the Red Robins enjoyed learning more about themselves and their new environment. The teachers are so proud of all the improvement the children have shown. As we move into fall, the Robins will continue learning through new experiences. We are looking forward to what the new season will bring!


#### **GREEN FROGS**

To introduce our new study, our circle times have been focused on showing the Green Frogs how to find shapes all around us! This helps the Green Frogs continue to develop the cognitive skills needed to think about objects symbolically.



We looked for circles, semicircles, squares, rectangles, triangles, and diamonds in toys inside our very own classroom! During playtime, we can hear excitement as the Green Frogs recognize and classify these shapes on their own! To work on fine-motor skills we practiced drawing these shapes on white boards with markers. This is a perfect way to introduce finger gripping a pencil once we transition into letter writing! Family Fun Night was also a great opportunity for our Green Frogs and all our other friends to show off their classrooms to parents! The children had so much fun playing our circus themed games and winning all sorts of silly prizes and treats.
