kindergarten program and we no longer had a kindergarten group. So, we switched again and went with strictly singing with our preschoolers. Each of the preschool groups had a time to perform on the stage with just their class, and then they all joined together for a few songs for a grand finale'.

GREEN FROGS

In the Green Frogs room, November was “out of this world” as we began our study on space. The Frogs began by learning about a few basic items in our solar system including the sun, planets, and constellations.

We spent a lot of time exploring the visual arts as we looked at many pictures of outer space and made art work of our own!

As the Frogs discussed and shared their knowledge of the characteristics of



the sun, we came to the agreement that the sun is a large, hot star that is yellow and orange. The Frogs also expanded on their expressive language as they learned the new vocabulary term: solar flare. To make our own suns, the Frogs used their fingers and hands to move paint around a paper circle that they had cut themselves; which led to great conversations about mixing colors.

Constellation is another new vocabulary term that was introduced to the Frogs this month. The Frogs demonstrated their ability to think symbolically as they viewed pictures of popular constellations and tried to identify the picture that the stars created. After viewing many constellations, the Frogs each created one of their own by using their fine-motor coordination to peel and place glowing star stickers onto a paper background. The Frogs used white chalk to connect their stars and perfect their constellation.

We ended our month by talking about several of the planets. The Frogs improved their ability to listen to and understand

complex language as we discussed several distinguishing features of the planets Mercury, Venus, Earth, and Mars. The Frogs sharpened their fine-motor strength and coordination as they cut small, medium, and large planets of their own. Using marble painting techniques, the Frogs designed their own unique and colorful planets to display in our room.

The Green Frogs also enjoyed a tasty Thanksgiving feast with their Red Robins friends! We gobbled up turkey, stuffing, mashed potatoes, corn bread, and apple crisp as we shared what we are thankful for and enjoyed great conversation! Miss Fran, Miss Wendy and Miss Jessica

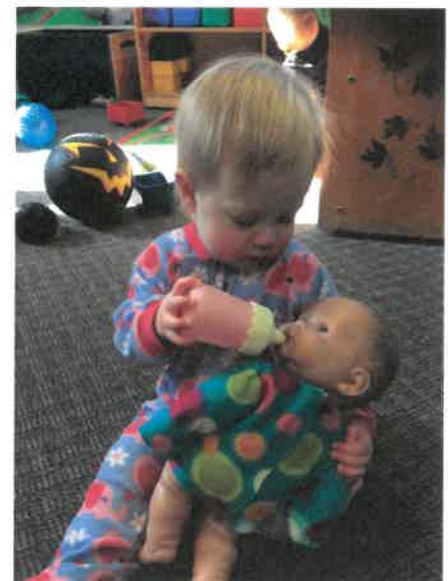
YELLOW DUCKS

Pink balloons were blown up and pig faces, tails, and numbers were then added to each balloon. The balloons were placed all over the classroom. When the buzzer went off each child had to go find their numbered pigs and using their traveling skills and balance, return them to the corral without using their hands. The Gills were running around the classroom laughing at themselves and giggling at each other. We had such a great time with this activity that we did it over and over for the rest of the week.

PURPLE PARROTS

During the month of November, the toddlers dove into learning by engaging in many different hands on activities. To start the month off, the children explored and collected many different size, shape, and colored leaves. Their collections lead to several meaningful conversations and the introduction to new vocabulary. The toddlers shouted out the different colors and made observations and comparisons such as wet leaves vs dry leaves. What a great way to explore nature!

Moving closer to the week of Thanksgiving, the toddlers switched gears while continuing to engage in sensory play. One of their favorite activities was sorting through "turkey feathers" in the sensory bin. Using their fine motor skills and communication skills, the toddlers discussed how the feathers felt and the different colors that they saw. After each of the toddlers had a turn playing with the feathers, we sat together and read several books that featured turkeys. As a group we compared the turkey feathers in the books to the feathers we had played with prior. This was a great way to form strong connections and

incorporate books into the daily routine.

Finally, the toddlers continued to learn some new sign language! This month the children were introduced to the words eat and mouse! Ask them to show you them at home!

ORANGE OWLS

As the Orange Owls flew through November, they immersed themselves in all aspects of building. They began with the core basics of building. What types of buildings there are, what materials are needed to build various structures, and the names of those who build and design said buildings. The Owls were quick to catch onto the overall ideas of building.

We dug a bit deeper as we began to discuss the different "layers" that must take place to make the entire building complete. In other words, we took it all the way down to the studs! With our hands-on version of a house, the Owls were able to put in some of the various layers discussed such as the pipes for the water, the lines for the electric, and the shingles and tiles for the floors and roof. With this activity it showed the Owls that not all materials that are very much needed are necessarily seen in their entirety.

We moved on to other structures such as bridges and monuments around the world. With bridges it was a lot of cause and effect as the Owls tried to recreate and design their own bridges in several different settings. This was difficult at times for them to be able to look at the situation, see what problems they are having, and then how to go about fixing them in a manner they had not tried yet. The

critical thinking and problem-solving skills were put to the test throughout each of these situations.

There were many long pauses and doubts as they had multiple failed attempts, but this was just the beginning of them using their past experiences and knowledge to be able to succeed at the task at hand. As a class they prevailed more than once in our team building activities that really did need

RED ROBINS

November was a busy month for the Red Robins. As the weather grew colder the Red Robins had to find new and exciting activities to do inside. The Red Robins love to dance, and we have discovered quite a few new favorite songs.

The Red Robins explored other cultures through music and have decided that our favorite song to dance to is the Mexican Hat Dance. With a few practice sessions all the Red Robins have become comfortable with the dance. The Red Robins also discovered a song called the Freeze Dance. This dance, which gives directions to the kids on what to do and when to freeze, helps the Red Robins work on controlling their body movements as well as expanding group play.

The Red Robins art this month has been focused on exercising fine motor skills. The Red Robins were given turkeys with circles and the Red Robins were asked to use

daubers and put different colored dots in the circles. This activity worked on the Red Robins fine motor skills and spatial relationships. We created marble leaf paintings by putting two marbles in a large yogurt container. This helped the

two brains working as one. For some it took more than a few attempts, but once they did put their thinking caps together the groups did phenomenally! We are now looking forward to what great studies this cold weather will bring us!
